This is an **Addendum to Lesson 1** providing a treatment of the features of Skitch 3.1 which is the newest version of this app that lets you mark up a picture.

Videos on Skitch 3.1

Some of you have asked about the methods I use for doing these videos. I am glad to show you directly in our one-on-one conversations but I use these two styles commonly. Over the last 24 hours, I have made two videos for you that are focused on Skitch 3.1 which is a major upgrade from the previous version.

- a) video on Skitch 3.1 made with iPhone (8 minutes) http://youtu.be/Le9dy_6Qgvg
- b) video made using Quicktime (13 minutes) to record the computer screen with the iPad wireless connected to the iPad via AirServer and AirPlay (or a substitute) http://youtu.be/k-rltUNHaxA

Each type of video has an advantage. Style A allows the user to view fingers on the iPad which can be helpful in instruction but results in shaky, wobbly videos since I have not yet found a tripod that focuses down on a table (John Sebastian, cheapo/cheapo productions, if you remember this folk singer from the 1960s). Style B allows clearer, crispier, non-wobbly videos but sometimes it is not clear to the user where to press which is why I try to use my voice when recording.

How to Save Using Skitch 3.1




At the upper right of the drawing screen above you will see the licon which leads to SHARE. But this five letter word is intended by the Skitch company to mean what we all refer to as SAVE. When you chose this icon, you will see a screen like this one wiht many choices. The bottom left one means SAVE to CAMERA ROLL. No longer does Skitch have its own library but it saves to the CAMERA ROLL also known as the PHOTO LIBRARY.




Another new feature of Skitch 3.1 involves the options when you choose to make a NEW skitch. There

are five icons at the upper right. The third one down looks like an upside down TEAR DROP and it allows you to go to any location around the world and get a map that you can use for your Skitch

image. The fourth one down looks like a COMPASS and it allows you to go to any webpage or web picture that you can then use for your Skitch image.



Once you are looking at the map or webpage you want to use, just find the red SNAP button which is located at upper right or lower right of the screen.





By the way the top button of those five buttons changes you from seeing your entire CAMERA ROLL (left) to seeing just the most recent items added to your camera roll (right). When on the screen on the right, it is the up arrow where you see my finger which takes you to the full camera roll screen.

Finally, we have the feature I have been waiting for -- Skitch now allows you to SAVE your picture into Dropbox or Google Drive.
