

So far we have learned about BINARY CODES and ASCII CODES in Lesson 3.

Now it is time to learn about a third type of code called a QR code which looks like this:




Have you seen them in magazines or newspapers? QR stands for Quick Response. This 2D Bar Code system was invented in 1994 by a subsidiary of Toyota.

Unlike binary where you can figure out that 1001 is 9 because it is a 1in the eights place and a 1 in the ones place, there are no humans who can figure out what the codes are above!

In order to figure out what these codes stands for, you need a software program that can READ a QR CODE. These are available for free for your smart phone, for your iPad or for your computer. If you have a smart phone or iPad, how about downloading QR Reader which lets you read a QR code, as you've seen or will see in my video? Or if you are on a computer, you can go to the website of http://www.the-grcode-generator.com and you can create a code.





Look at the left side. You can click where it says URL and then you can enter your Twitter website. Then you choose SAVE on the right side.



QR CODE Mesage Charlotte Nov 5


or

and make sure you either save onto the Desktop or into a Folder.

By the way, there are 3 rules when using and saving files. We in Summercore call them the Rule of Three.

Rule 1 -- good file name

Rule 2 --- what computer or disk are you saving on?

Rule 3 -- are you saving into a folder?
